Practical Applications

You read in the local newspaper about a town nearby and how one person asked others to purchase extra school supplies and then gave the supplies to a school. The wheels begin to turn. What can your Aglow group do? Sign up or walk away?

4. While watching the news, you become aware of the increasing homeless population in your community. Winter is coming and with it extremely cold weather. What are some practical steps that your Aglow group can take to help those living on the streets? Gather supplies? Make sandwiches to hand out on certain days? Ignore it?
