PART I:

WHY ISRAEL?

- A. Because God made a covenant with the people and the land
 - 1. With Abraham – Genesis 12:1-3
 - 2. Reaffirms the covenant with Isaac–Genesis 26:1-4
 - 3. Reaffirms the covenant with Jacob–Genesis 28:13-15
 - 4. Reaffirms the covenant with Moses–Exodus 33:1
 - 5. Reaffirms the covenant with Joshua–Joshua 1:2-5

- B. The covenant with the people
 - 1. 1 Chronicles 17:21-22
 - 2. Exodus 4:22-23
 - 3. Psalm 147:19-20
 - 4. Deuteronomy 7:6-7
 - 5. Amos 3:2a

 - 5. Ezekiel 16:60 (following God's charges against Israel for their spiritual adultery)
 - 6. Malachi 3:6
 - 7. Numbers 23:19
 - 8. Additional scriptures: Isaiah 54:4-10; 55:3; 59:21

- E. The covenant in the New Testament
 - 1. Romans 9-11
 - 2. Specifically these verses:
 - a. Romans 9:1-5
 - b. Romans 10:1
 - c. Romans 11:1-5, 11-26, 29 (the entire chapter)

F. The plan of God

1. God's purpose: to use the man and the woman to bring forth His image in the earth, and to bring forth the world's Deliverer through them
2. Genesis 3:15 – Eve's Seed would crush the enemy's head
3. Through the Israelites, the family that began with Adam and Eve, and became a nation through Abraham, God would redeem all peoples from the effect of sin (separation from Him)
4. All the families of the earth would be blessed through Abraham (Genesis 12:3)

G. The plan of the enemy

1. To destroy the people through whom Messiah would come
2. Began in the Garden – in his attempt to separate Adam and Eve and thwart God's plan
3. His plan to destroy the Israelites continued through the ages:
 - a. Pharaoh sought to keep them as slaves in bondage;
 - b. Following David's reign: division in the tribes of Israel, tried to destroy the family of David (through whose lineage Messiah would come);
 - c. Nation after nation attacked Israel. Foreign powers ruled Jerusalem;
 - d. Herod tried to kill the Messiah;
 - e. Haman sought to annihilate the Jews.
 - f. The Crusades, the Inquisition;
 - g. Hitler, modern-day Haman, sought to do the same;
 - h. Anti-Semitism;
 - i. Replacement Theology.

H. Israel is unique among nations and peoples

1. The fact of abiding amid relentless global Anti-Semitism
 2. The sustained presence of a people so maligned and repeatedly plotted against
 3. The profound influence of such a small ethnic group in such large socially-shaping ways (medicine, literature, education, finance, government)
 4. Their spiritually impacting presence on the minds and spirits of so much of mankind
- All this is evidence that the God of history has selected, appointed, and protected the Jewish people down through the millennia because He has purpose for them.

PART II:

WHY AGLOW?

A. For several years – Aglow is called as Esther, "for such a time as this"

B. 1999 Int'l Conference

1. Call of Esther: word about "ministry of Esthers"

C. 2000 – First journey into the land

1. First Aglow journey to Israel
2. Revelation given regarding Haman spirit
3. Camp David peace talks – Barak, Arafat, Clinton – concurrent with Aglow journey

- D. 2001 – The call confirmed
 - 1. Call on Jane Hansen and Aglow confirmed at a meeting in Florida – set apart, anointing, raise up Queen Esther’s court, repentance of replacement theology, injection into the global prayer movement, etc.
- E. 2002 – Two trips
 - 1. Two Aglow trips into Israel: Feast of Pentecost (250 people), Feast of Tabernacles (35 people)
 - 2. Prayed the borders, made scriptural proclamations
- F. 2003 – Significant timing
 - 1. “Road Map to Peace” meetings
 - 2. Aglow’s 4th trip into the land – 250 people
 - 3. Prayed the northern and southern borders
- G. 2004
 - 1. Aglow’s 5th trip into the land – 200 people
 - 2. Prayed the borders
 - 3. Celebrated the Feast of Pentecost with the Jewish people
- H. 2005/2006 – New connections
 - 1. Connecting with Messianic believers/ministries in the land
 - 2. 4 options, 2 day mini-conference

PART III:

WHY NOW?

- A. Because God has sovereignly spoken to Aglow
- B. Because we are living out Biblical prophecy in our time
 - 1. Since the establishment of Israel as a nation in 1948, the biblical timetable has advanced
- C. Because anti-Semitism is on the rise and is at pre-World War II levels
