| The Scripture: John 8:31, 32 |
| "To the Jews who had believed Him, Jesus said, 'If you hold to My teaching, you are really My disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." |

| Yes, the Word of God can give life or set us free. But that isn't all it does. Scripture tells us that it also has the power to heal, it gives faith, it cleanses, it restrains, it provides warning, it renews our life, it give us understanding and peace, and it helps keep us pure. Certainly no other book in the world has the power to do that. |

| "The word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart." |
